





Although the subject matter doesn't really affect model railroading, more railfaning, it might prove to be of interest to those or our fraternity who can honestly say " I got the measurements before it was gone ".

Whats happening is the Soo Line owns a beautiful (translated this means slowly run down and weathered) depot in Mundelein. The railroad is paying taxes on the structure which they aren't using. They want to tear it down, can't really fault them.

The Fort Hill Historical club and local residents like the flavor and the looks of the old girl. even though she's had her North end bashed in by one of the many derailments in Mundelein in the '60's. It was then the Soo discovered that their trains were running through Mundelein at 45 mph on track that was only good for 25 mph, so they upgraded the track which is now really first rate.

The society wants to preserve the depot and move it to an adjacent park to be established as a heritage area. Will they be successful? Let's hope so.

The society has a slide presetation on the depot which I will check out for possible viewing of the FVD members.

Just a bit of trivia for those who recall the controversy of putting stations on curves on model railroads and the hullabaloo that the nitpickers raised saying " It ain't prototype". The Mundelein depot is on a curve as the Libertyville Milwaukee Road station.

November is model railroad month and the Palatine Savings and Loan, Palatine Rd. and Brockway Ave., will again display their N gauge railroad in the lobby of their savings facility.

The railroad is an N gauge layout about 15x8 which was constucted and is maintained by members of the FVD, NMRA. The track plan is a elongated pretzel shape with a six track yard and a turntable.


Each year an addition is made to the layout. A second mainline is currently being added which will provide operation of the two trains in different directions.

The railroad is in operation daily during banking hours and is operated by members of the FVD. You HO'ers stop by and see how well N gauge functions.

The first diesel locomotives in mainline service in the USA were used on the CB&Q and UP railroads in 1934. The first diesels on regular freight work went into service on the AT&SF in 1940.

US mail was first carried by rail on the South Carolina Railroad in November 1831, and on the B&O in January 1832.



This months profile is on the VALLEY MODEL RAILROAD ASSOCIATION. They are located 4 mile west of route 25 on Kenyon road in south Elgin.

The VALLEY MODEL RAILROAD ASSOCIATION was formed March 1949 making it one of the oldest clubs in the area. In 1953 the club moved from downtown Elgin to it's present location in the Clintonville station, home of Chicago Aurora and Elgin Railroad.

At present the club has over 1,200 feet of track and 10,000 feet of wiring installed. There are 157 switches most are automatically controlled. All four mainline cabs have transistorized throttles with dial a head block controll and are located about 8 feet above the layout for better viewing of what's going on.

The VALLEY MODEL RAILROAD ASSOCIATION meets every Wednesday night at 7:00pm, with the second Wednesday of the month being the association meeting. The first Wednesday is reserved for visitors and for operating.

PLANNING COMMITTEE: is responsible for the long range needs and goals of the division. It is there job to investigate all possible activities for the division's members.


