HIS MONTH WE ARE going on a layout tour in Glenview called "HO TWICE & HALF," How-

ever; we will start at the church hall with a short meeting in which we will discuss current division affairs including the upcoming HIGHWHEELER '89.

Maps will then be given out for the layout tour and we will travel in two groups in order that only half of the members will be at the home layouts at one time. You should plan to arrive at your first layout at 2:30 p.m. and at your second at 3:30 p.m.

Usually most layout tours are to HO layouts, but this is going to be different because one layout is "O" gauge (Lionel) which is "TWICE HO" and the other layout is "N" gauge which is "HALF HO."

The "TWICE HO" layout is the celebrated LIONEL layout of Stan Roy which was featured in the recent book titled "Toy Train Layouts of America." Stan will operate 27 trains on six loops and three levels, automatically and all at the same time. It is, as far as anyone knows, a world's record for simultaneous operation by one person. Stan has over \$100,000 invested in his layout and some engines cost over \$2,000 apiece.

The "HALF HO" layout is the "N" gauge Blue Diamond Railroad of Jim Goettsche and although it is not completely finished with scenery he will be in operation for our visit. Jim is quite active in our sister division, North Shore & Western, and has had his HO modular group at our HIGH-WHEELER and he has been a presenter at our meetings.

Once again, we wish to point out that this layout tour will be different than the usual HO only tours. IMPORTANT


All members can help in the following ways:
