scale modeler may use glass for windows, but that 1/32" glass scales to over an inch thick! As you asked, "How accurate is that?"

Many modelers need to use selective compression to get the right "feel" in their layouts. I'm modeling a portion of downtown Chicago, so "The Loop" winds up being about two blocks long and wide, and I am removing the "boring" buildings, ones that don't destroy the feeling of the area if they're not there. If I wanted to include the Sears Tower, it would be 8 feet tall without selective compression. Most outdoor railways have

buildings three stories high or shorter. As you asked, "How accurate is that?" And I can take the equivalent one of those 4'x8' layouts from Model Railroader and fit it in a 25"x40" space. Or, I can have an 8-track classification yard on a 2' wide area, and still have room for scenery.

Where do you stand? Large scale, small scale, or in between?


