February 2010 Illinois Rail Museum Update

We noted a bit of history and some of the highlights of the Fox River Trolley Museum's 2009 season in last November's issue of the Semaphore. The Semaphore's editor has finally found some space to let us continue with highlights of the Illinois Railway Museum's summer, and it was an eventful one!

The Nebraska Zephyr train set returned to regular operation following off campus repairs from an earlier accident. The Zephyr looked and ran as beautiful as ever. The Diesel Department also unveiled the recently restored CB&Q SD 24 #504 as part of last summer's Diesel Days celebration. The big SD was painted in the gorgeous Chinese red, gray and white scheme. The 2010 IRM calendar features the 504, and Zephyr along with Burlington SW7 #9255 and 4-6-4 Class S4 steamer #3007 in an impressive all CB&Q photo display. One diesel acquisition of note last summer was ex-Santa Fe FM H12-44 TS road switcher #543 still adorned in blue and yellow paint. The switcher, seen below, is a particularly nice addition to the museum's collection, having worked much of its life switching passenger cars at Chicago Union Station and environs.





The IRM Steam Department also had a busy summer as it worked to restore steam to the museum's regular operating line-up. UP 2-8-0 #428 seen above, was test fired late last summer. This was the first time in fifty years the 428 had felt the warmth of a fire in her boiler. Slow but steady progress continues to be made on Frisco 1630, and Shay #5. The big question for 2010 is, "Is this the summer we see steam return to IRM rails?" Only time will tell, but the Steam Team is getting close.

The annual Trolley Parade was greatly expanded in 2009 with many rarely seen cars operating—some on the mainline at speed! Cars with pantographs were included in the operations thanks to the IRM's Overhead Wire Department's extensive work. The Trolleybus Department added several new pieces, as well as announcing that it has entered into an agreement with the Orange Empire Trolley Museum in California to see an exchange of work and rare trolley busses.

Finally, a new car barn was built giving much needed shelter to a number of cars, and the wood shop had a large extension added to it. All in all, 2009 was a very good year for the IRM, and 2010 could be even better!

Each year Elgin's Ted Schnepf graciously opens his home and huge, multi-decked O scale Dubuque Division Railroad to the Fox Valley Division for a January operating session. Highlighting this year was the use of Ted's new 1,400 square foot room addition to the railroad. Though only about 25% finished, enough mainline and yard track was in place to really show the new room's potential. The new addition features a lengthened main line, sweeping curves, a new yard, and a ten foot ceiling making an already great rail road even better.
