IRM Makes Major Electric Acquisitions

In October 2009 The Illinois Railway Museum successfully bid on and became the new home for six electric cars of the ex-Lake Shore Electric Railway Museum's outstanding collection. The collection, known as the "Trolleyville Collection" of over 30 electric cars, was originally assembled by the late real estate developer Gerry Brookins in Ohio. It was decided to disband and dispose of the collection in 2009. Among the cars in the collection were several beautiful and rare Chicago, Aurora and Elgin cars. IRM bid on nine cars and ended up acquiring six of them thanks to the generous help of Julia Johnson who individually underwrote the purchase of four of the cars. Total bid price for the cars and additional parts for other projects was just slightly over \$150,000. Four of the six cars are operational and the other two nearly so. The cars are:

- CA&E wood bodied electrics #36 and #319. #36 was an original car to the railroad when it began operations in 1912.
- CA&E steel cars #409, #451, and #460. The 409 is the only remaining Pullman built car, while the 451 and 460 are from the St. Louis Car. Co.
- Vera Cruz #19, a single truck, open air car built by Brill which worked in Vera Cruz Mexico. This open air car should be a huge hit operating at IRM.
- A separate purchase from the LSE collection and not part of the original bid, was an ex-Twin Cities, Minnesota PCC street car.

Most of the work done by both museums was done at the last minute with the bidding, financing, and relocation completed over a four month period. This was a considerable and well executed effort by IRM to add some superb pieces.
