

February Meeting Clinic – "Traction – Where one car is the whole train"

The February clinic by Ed Halstead, Carl Lantz and John Cloos provided the in depth coverage of everything traction. If you needed that last little push to get started, everything you needed to know was covered. Ed started by covering the standards for O Scale and HO scale traction. Mentioning the differing scales used in the US and Everywhere else and the different wheel sizes that can cause problems in switch frogs.

Ed and Carl categorized the various types of traction in O scale and HO scale and covered prototypes, models, resources, parts, kits, tools and wiring of models. traction models and short histories of the lines serving passengers from Chicago to Fox Valley destinations.

The Category for February was "Wooden Structures". A variety of types were entered.

The First Place Winner was Mike Pavlina for his "Bailey's Produce structure made from a George Selios kit and modified as only Mike does it.



Second Place went to Art Jones for his "Two Stall Engine House" made from a 30 year old Fine Scale Miniatures kit and according to Art, rebuilt after long storage during which the metal castings homogenized the completed kit interior and parts.



Jim Allen received the **Third Place** award for "Barn" built, surprisingly, from a round top wooden purse. Jim removed the hardware and covered the form with stripwood. He also used vinyl rock wall coverings for the foundation.

On Sunday, February 6th, FVD member, Bill Boyd, hosted the Festival of Passenger Trains at the home of Art Jones in Lindenhurst. This was the third consecutive annual event. The previous festivals had been hosted on Bill's famous Kearny and Black Hills layout. Bill recently moved into a condo and, unfortunately, had to dismantle his dramatic Kearney & Black Hills Railroad (Featured in Model Railroader magazine a number of years ago).

This year's festival ran on Art Jones' HO Scale Connellsville Division of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad and showcased passenger trains of the past. Art and Bill invited 13 trains and had the engineers provide a short explanation of their history.

Jim Osborn comments: "I have participated in two of Bill's festivals so far and thoroughly enjoyed the experience each time. The first featured Trains of Fallen Flags and this one – Great Passenger Trains. I was able to see some wonderful models of historic trains and was forced to learn some additional facts about my home railroad as I researched the CNW's Kate Shelley 400. Bill has introduced a great concept that might serve as an activity on others' railroads: get a bunch of modelers together to have some fun, show off some equipment and expand knowledge of trains. Give it a try in whatever dimension fits your situation."

Bill has had to scale down his modeling activities to a 2 x 8 foot switching layout that fits in a small room of the condo. When asked what the next Festival might focus on, he joked, "It may have to be The Festival of Switchers!"




About the Fox Valley Division
