

In the next couple of pages we'll show you some of the Rail-Fun layouts you might not be familiar with. Above left is a small part of Greg Bedleck's large, 2,700 square foot HO Great Northern/Northern Pacific layout in Kildeer. The layout features freight, passenger, and interchange trains with lots of industrial switching. The above right HO layout belongs to Bill Drzal in West Chicago who models the CNW in Peoria in 1976. Track and scenery are 100% finished on this nicely done layout. To the immediate right is the Elmhurst Model Railroad Club's HO layout. They also have an N scale layout and an HOn3 layout. If you haven't seen this club in a while, be prepared to for some nice additions and several changes to their original layouts.





Another great club layout is the Garfield Central Model Railroad Club in Chicago (above left). Their HO layout is 27 x 50 feet and has 1,500 feet of hand laid track, built in place turnouts, 42 inch radius curves on the mainline and NCE DCC. Scenery is mostly done throughout the layout. Jeff Jarr's freelanced CNW layout takes up most of his 30 x 32 foot basement with big time Class I railroading in HO scale. You'll see a double track main line, big structures, big bridges and lots of CNW green and yellow diesels on this layout depicting a fictional line from Chicago to Duluth.

The HO railroad on the right is the creation of Chicago's Ed Lorence. Ed models the B&O as it existed in 1954. The layout has beautiful eastern mountain scenery, great structures and bridges, transition era B&O steam and diesels, and Class I freight and passenger operations. This terrific layout has been featured in RMC and on an Allen Keller video.







Another great B&O layout is Art Jones' Fairmont, M&P Sub (upper left) located in Lindenhurst. This nicely sceniced, operations oriented, multi-level layout occupies Art's 30 x33 foot basement. On the upper right is a great model railroad in the making in DesPlaines: Steve Haworth's standard gauge Rio Grande Southern. This railroad fills Steve's 27 x 39 foot basement and is a very nicely designed, operations oriented pike.

HOn3 Colorado narrow gauge is what Waukegan's Dan Sylvester models and models very well (above left). This 4 x 8 jewel is the smallest at RailFun and features scratch built structures and rolling stock, exquisitely re-motored steam locomotives, beautiful detailing, and operations by the book based on Dan's 38 years experience as a railroad conductor. One of the largest RailFun layouts is Ted Schnepf's O scale Milwaukee Road (above right) which occupies a 35 x 70 foot "original" layout room, *and* a "new" 33 x 40 foot addition to his basement in Elgin. Standard and narrow gauge are modeled with track work and scenery 100% complete in the original room, and most track work and some scenery done in the new addition. Ted has done the "King of the Gauges" proud with this huge layout.

The FVD's own David Crement, MMR and railroad historian (right), will be giving a clinic on Pennsylvania's narrow gauge, East Broad Top, a railroad he has researched extensively for over 30 years. John will explore how to model mid-western, home-built transfer cabooses such as the Milwaukee Road transfer cab at the lower left.

Prototype Tours



RailFun is offering two historic prototype tours. The first is to Kloke Locomotive Works in Elgin Friday morning. Kloke is building a close replica of the Lincoln Funeral car (above) in preparation for its 2015 trip from Washington, D.C. to Springfield, Illinois following, as closely as possible 150 years later, the train trip that took Lincoln's body back to Illinois after his assassination. The train will travel on rail roads whenever possible and be transported by flat bed truck the other times. Kloke's 4-4-0 Leviathan will power the train which is expected to include one other historic car.



The Friday afternoon Illinois Railway Museum tour promises to be an outstanding one. Attendees will be shown almost all the back shops and work areas of the museum including the steam, diesel, car, electric, carpentry, etc. shops. The tour also includes a train ride.
