

Clinic Presentation: Home Manufactured Track by Gary Saxton, FVD

The clinic will describe how to use a 3D filament printer to make tie jigs for traditional and dead rail track, switches and specialty items. You will need to register and purchase a ticket prior to visiting the facility if you are going to take the exclusive Diesel Shop Tour as well as the CNW and Milwaukee Road archive tours. The deadline for registering and payment is Saturday July 19, 2025.

Guests are welcome but only on a contingent basis if space is not filled up by regular FVD members. If you want to bring a guest, please register and pay for them by the deadline. We will refund any fees for registrations that cannot be accommodated. We apologize for this limitation on guests participation, but we are restricted to a maximum attendance of 40 people for the tours. We will be moving through an industrial shop environment so please dress accordingly. Open toed shoes and loose fitting garments or wraps are discouraged. Please provide for your own transportation. There are no bus or car pool arrangements provided by the FVD.
