

Dreams, Themes and Scenes

As fall rapidly approaches, also comes the season of train shows, club meets, and model railroad layout presentations. All these events provide opportunities to meet with old friends and make new ones, both in, and for, the model railroad hobby. I have long enjoyed participating in these events both in participation and presentation. For many years, I displayed a small modular N-scale layout, the H:oosie Hills Scenic Railroad, at places ranging from division events to one National Train Show, and at special events in local libraries, schools, nursing and retirement homes, as at business activities.

Then came a day when an almost tragic automobile accident resulted in irreparable damage to the layout. It was damaged so badly that its last appearance depicted a tornado scene from the movie *TWISTER*Since then, I have built and displayed other portable layouts, including one in G-scale, on in On30, and now a very small layout in N and G scales. At the same time, I have been building a larger N-scale layout in my train room at home.

None of these have given me the personal satisfaction I had with the original N-scale layout. So I've been dreaming. I dream of a layout that is very mobile, one that can be handled at all times by me alone, one that will have two or three trains running at one time, one that can be stored very easily in a small area. I wanted to be able to take this

layout anywhere, and operate it even if electrical service was not available. I wanted this layout, (when complete), to be of a quality to earn sufficient points to earn me a Master Builder-Scenery Certificate in the NMRA Achievement Program. As Achievement Program Manager for the Midwest Region, I tell myself that I should do as I encourage others to do, and also write an article for publication to receive points toward a Model Railroad Author Certificate.

I decided that the first part of this project must be to establish goals, identify limitations, and establish a starting point. The first and most important goal was to establish a budget and plan to build within the budget limitation. I elected to stay with N-scale because I already have experience, engines, rolling stock, and building in that scale. I also decided to stay with DC power, because I have the controllers and intend to operate trains more or less continuously, rather than lots of switching, starting and stopping. I also intend to install sound as a part of individual scenes rather than into operating trains.

The second goal was to design a lightweight, but very study base for the layout that could be moved about, through narrow halls and doors, and which could also be loaded onto a pick-up truck by myself with ease.

Therefore, I decided the maximum overall weight of the layout, frame, and all accessories should not be more that 85 lbs. My thoughts turned to developing a steel frame, on coasters, which would support a layout of the minimum 18'2 required for a

Scenery Certificate, and which could be folded to pass through doors as narrow as 30".

I visited local building supply houses and found that square tubular steel material would probably fill the requirements I envisions. After designing a workable frame, I took my design to fellow modeler Matt Hewitt. Matt suggested design improvements and then fabricated the frame. He used one by one-half inch tubular steel for the frame base and the uprights on which the layout top would be attached. The bottom frame, which also provides the footprint for storage and transporting, is 74" long and 26" wide. Matt also welded 3" stationary casters on one end of the frame, and swivel casters on the other end. This will allow the layout to be moved through almost any door and maneuvered through narrow corridors or crowded rooms. It is also a size easily loaded in a pick-up truck with a topper, that I will use for transporting. The total weight of the complete frame and legs is 29lbs. Figure 1 is a picture of the completed frame w/o the foam base inserted; and folded in the storage/transport position.

The wooden frame on which the layout will be built has is now finished. I developed a design to support a base of 2-3x6 foot sheets

of extruded foam building insulation for a total thickness of 1½". A high quality white pine lumber was selected for this purpose, because it was lightweight, and had a nice grained surface, without knots and blemishes. My friend, Vern Parks, a master woodworker, cut and trimmed the boards. and then assembled them to size with rabbet joints at the corners that are also supported by triangular wood braces. This provides a frame that won't twist or warp easily, yet is light weight and very nice looking. The total weight of the metal support frame, the wood layout support frame, and attaching fixtures are just a few ounces under 40lbs. This is less than half the total weight, I expected the finished layout to reach, and will allow for easy handling by just me. Figure 2 shows the layout set up as it will be when ready for work, or show. Figure 3 shows the layout folded ready for transport or storage.

Now it is time for my scheme, to select a layout purpose, track plans, and select scenes that will be depicted on the four separate viewing sides of the table. I hope to have at least one track operating so I can demonstrate this at its first show in three weeks. I will report on the progress in the next WAYBILL.


