A few things I would like to emphasize here is that accurate record keeping, by you, the member, is very important in the AP.

Keeping track of what you do, as you do it, is the very best way to go about getting a certificate. All the record and validation forms are available at the NMRA website. So if you are thinking about going for a certificate, print out the forms and keep track of what you do as you do it. Also, the AP program only works if you get involved in it. I can't do it for you.

So if you are interested in getting involved with the AP or have a question, contact you division AP Manager first and work with that person. If your division does not have an AP Manager, then certainly contact me. I will try to answer any

questions that you have. I am also working on becoming an MMR with one more certificate to go

I got involved with the AP to try to become a better modeler. In the past years, entering our division contests have been very rewarding. My skill as a modeler has greatly increased because of my involvement in the AP. The constructive criticism from the judges are always a big help to show you how to improve. I know that I am a better modeler because of the Achievement Program. Hopefully you will have the same experiences.

In recent AP news, Rich Hanke, of Manitowoc, Wisconsin has received the AP Structures certificate #793. Rich is a fine HO scale modeler and worked for the Green Bay & Western Railroad for a while. His was the first certificate that was processed by me as the MWR AP Manager.

There are a few other members that are working on getting certificates in my Winnebagoland Division, so I am happy to report that there is always some activity going on every month in the AP. Be sure to bring those models that you have been working on all winter to the contest at the MWR Spring meet in Indiana.






