Minutes, Annual MWR Members Meeting April 21, 2007

2008 Election

Petition Deadline Is September 6

Although the 2008 election is several months away, it is time to start the election cycle. In 2008 we will elect four (4) Directors-at-Large.

Roger Wurtzel from the Winnebagoland Division, one of the four incumbent DALs, will complete his second two-year term in 2008 and under the Bylaws will not be eligible to run for another term in 2008. Our thanks to Roger for his dedicated service. Sean Lamb from the South Central Wisconsin Division, Bob Lehnen from the Central Indiana Division and Dave Poquette from the Wisconsin Southeastern Division will complete their first two-year terms and will be eligible to run for another term in 2008.

There are two ways that your name can be placed on the ballot. The first is by recommendation of the Nominating Committee and approval of the Board of Directors. To be considered by the Nominating Committee (Chairman Jim Spice from the North Shore & Western Division and Members Reid Kahrs from the Wisconsin Southeastern Division and Jim Osborn from the Fox Valley Division), you must submit a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo to the Committee with a copy to the Region Secretary (Bert Lattan) as soon as possible, but no later than September 6, 2007.

The preferred method of delivery is electronic mail. (While e-mail is not required to serve on the Board, it is highly desirable since the Board conducts pre and post meeting activity by e-mail.) If you do not have e-mail, you may mail your bio/photo to Bert Lattan, who will convert it to an electronic format

and send it to the Committee. Addresses and e-mail addresses for the Committee and the Secretary are on the Region website (www.mwr-nmra.org).

The second method is by petition signed by at least ten (10) current, resident NMRA members. The petition form is available on the Region website or it may be requested from Bert Lattan. Your petition must be accompanied by a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo. It must be received by Bert Lattan no later than September 6, 2007. He will convert it to an electronic format and forward it to the Committee.

The Committee will submit its recommendations and the names of all resident members nominated by petition to the Board of Directors for review and approval during its next meeting, which will be held on Sunday, October 21, 2007 in Prospect Heights, Illinois at the Gary Morava Recreation Center.

Each candidate's biography/statement & photo and a ballot will be included in the Winter 2007 issue of the *Waybill*. The results of the election will be announced during the 2008 Annual Meeting of Members. The meeting will be held during the 2008 Spring Convention, which is scheduled for May 9-11 at the Best Western Grand Seasons Hotel and Conference Center in Waupaca, Wisconsin.

Railroad Research for the Modeler – Prototype Periodicals

This is the third installment of a series of articles about the Kalmbach Memorial Library and its resources.

We are all familiar with today's model railroad magazines like *Model Railroader* and *Railroad*

Model Craftsman, and for prototype information we can read Railfan & Railroad, the newly revived Passenger Train Journal, or Trains which has been on newsstands since 1941 (just to name a few). However, one prototype periodical which has been in publication (under various names) for the past 150 years is Railway Age. This is an outstanding publication to which the modeler and prototype historian can often turn for equipment and structure drawings, plus features and news from the various railroads (see illustrations).

The publication can trace its roots back to 1856 as the Western Railroad Gazette, published in Chicago. Only a few copies are known to exist, none of which are in the library's collection. In 1870 the name was changed to Railroad Gazette and it became the railroad industry's leading periodical. Railway Age was a competitor and in June of 1908 it was acquired by Railway Gazette. The two magazines formed the Railroad Age Gazette, a name it would retain until the end of 1909 when it changed to Railway Age Gazette (1910-17), and finally Railway Age (1918present). Another competitor, Railway Review was acquired in 1926. While the library's collection is not complete we do have most issues from 1878 to present day. The website (www.nmra.org/library under "Our Collection") lists all issues in the library's collection.

As with any source, the information is only useful if you can find it. We have a very good index to these and other prototype periodicals prepared by noted railroad historian Thomas T. Taber III, who spent more than 7,000 hours indexing about 80 different periodicals. Also, all annual volumes have an index making it easy to find out what articles have been published in a specific year. The library staff makes extensive use of these industry periodicals, which also include the aforementioned *Railway Review*, as well as *Signal Engineer*, *American Engineer & Railroad Journal*, and *Electric Railway Journal* (incl. predecessors *Street Railway Journal* and *Street Railway Review*).

NMRA National Convention


For those of you that are still trying to make up your mind about going to the national convention in Detroit, there's still time to get in your registration, and join the fun.
