


Have a safe and healthy holiday season and remember, model railroading is fun!


Mad City Show and Sale along with the National Convention in 97. Along with starting a home layout, I joined the Madison HO Trak module group and started participating at shows in other divisions.

Since being retired during the last 11 years, I have become active again.




K.J. Duke Yerman (for MWR Director)


I have been a member of the NMRA for several years and recently shifted my membership to the Mid West Region. Being retired I will be able to spend time in helping our Division.

David Leider (Waybill Editor)


Hello fellow Midwest Region members. Although the Waybill editor is a volunteer position, I may as well include my photo and bio here.

Midwest Region Spring 2009 Convention Sponsored by the Rock River Valley Division April 17, 18, & 19, 2009

Once again, the convention will be held at the Clock Tower Resort and Convention Center, located off Interstate 90 at Business U.S. 20 (State St.) in Rockford, IL. Friday Night Operating Sessions

There will be five layouts open for Friday night operating sessions:

- 1. C&NW; HO, Galena Division, 1950-1960's steam/diesel, Digitrax (radio and walkaround), 6-8 operators
- 2. C&NW; HO, Sterling Division, 1945-1958, signals, 70% sceniced, Digitrax, 8 operators
- 3. Waukon, Mineral & Addison, HO, Free-lanced mid-west; 1915 steam; dispatcher; 20% sceniced; DC (walkaround and radio) throttles, 12-15 operators
- 4. Chicago, Champaign & Southern, HO, Free-lanced, 1964, 1st & 2nd generation diesel; new layout limited scenery, Rail Command radio throttles, 12-15 operators
- 5. CGW, HO, 1965, Dubuque, IA to German Valley IL, diesel, Digitrax, 8 operators

The operating sessions will be limited to the first 45 operators who register. Indicate your layout preference and the Registrar will make every attempt to get you to the one you want. A waiting list will be established for registrants who don't make the cut.

Layout Tours

We have layout tours planned for Friday night, Saturday afternoon, and Sunday afternoon. There will be 20-25 layouts open for your enjoyment as we go to press. About half are fully sceniced. Most layouts are diesel; some are steam.

Non-Rail Activities

The first stop on this year's expedition will be to the Burpee Museum of Natural History, home of Jane, the Tyrannosaurus Rex. After four years of preparation, Jane is now on display as the centerpiece of a new exhibit at Burpee Museum. Jane: Diary of a Dinosaur. Come discover what happened during the 66 million years she lay buried, visit the expedition's Montana base camp, and view Jane's fully restored 21-foot skeleton. You'll also see a 2 story Carboniferous Coal Forest, an exhibit about the Ordovician Sea that once covered Illinois, and exhibits about the first people to inhabit this area, including the wildlife of the Illinois wilderness.

The next stop is the Rockford Art Museum. RAM houses an extensive collection of American art from the 19th century through today, with a focus on work by historic and contemporary regional artists as well as American Masters, American Photography, Contemporary Glass Art, Modern and Contemporary Art, and Outsider Art.

Collection artists include Ansel Adams, Roger Brown, Harry Callahan, Dale Chihuly, Thornton Dial, Walker Evans, Ulrica Hydman-Vallien, Belle Emerson Keith, Roy Lichtenstein, Harvey Littleton, Pauline Palmer, Ed Paschke, George J. Robertson, Hollis Sigler, Lorado Taft, and Bertil Vallien.

If time permits, the Midway Village Museum is also nearby. The main museum building holds a number of permanent exhibits reflecting Rockford's history and culture that include The Girls of Summer: Rockford Peaches of the AAGPBL, Queen City of the Prairies: Rockford's First 20 Years and The Missing Link: Socks, Monkeys and Rockford's Industrial Past.

Admission fees to the museums will be subsidized. Transportation and lunch are on you. **For our planning purposes**, please indicate on the registration form if you are interested in the Non-Rail Tour.

Model/Photo Contest

Models will be judged in the Master and Novice classes. The Master class is for those modelers who have won a 1st place in the category at the regional level. The Novice class is for those have not won a 1st place yet. The following categories will be judged: steam locomotives, diesel locomotives, traction, passenger cars, freight cars, cabooses, on-line structures, off-line structures, on-line displays and off-line displays.

The photo contest will include Model and Prototype in Black and White, Color Slide, and Color Print.

And don't forget the Bob Moskal Memorial Award for models and the Mick Grimsby award for best all-around N-scale model.







