

Mid West Region NMRA – Winter 2011

President's Report By Bill Litkenhous, President, MWR



I then headed to the museum to work. I grabbed my tool box which is a former NYC metal first aid box and as I got out of my car the metal latch caught on my door and opened, spilling all of my tools on the parking lot payment. I gathered up my equipment and fastened the box securely and headed into the museum.

As I walked up the steps I viewed a notice posted on the door that hit me very hard. The notice said that the museum would be closed Friday and Saturday because of the sudden death of one of the volunteers. Jimmie Snook, 69, a retired CSX/L&N conductor had a heart attack the day before and passed away. Jimmie was our caboose specialist and had worked on our display caboose to make it reflect the way it was equipped during the days it was active on the railroads. Jimmie also manned the caboose during open houses and school tours explaining its use.

Just several weeks earlier I had stopped in the caboose to talk to Jimmie before I went home. We sat in the caboose and talked at length about things railroading. The conversation was not about anything specific but as I remember it was very interesting. I just wish that I had done this more frequently.

After recovering from this shock, I headed into the layout room in the basement of the museum to start working on my current project and found John Campbell, Andy Long and Cecil Smith standing there pondering the next step they needed to take to get the trains running properly. For some unknown reason our automation system had stop functioning. The system is a series of photocells and





relays that control the turnouts at ends of the four sidings where the trains pass each other during normal operations. The switch machines we use are tortoises and the contacts also control the stopping blocks that hold trains while the opposing train runs through and then triggers the turnout releasing the stopped train. It has worked virtually flawlessly for the time I have worked at the museum, almost ten years. With the Christmas open house coming up the Saturday after Thanksgiving it was imperative that we get it up and running again. By the end of the day the system was up and running again but I have been told that since then it has gone down again. It appears that one of the photocells has gone bad and will have to be replaced. We will have trains running for the open house though probably only in one direction. And we will have the caboose manned for the open house by Richard Cantwell, a former CSX/L&N/Monon engineer. Life will continue though not as we would like.

This past September we had the Fall Midwest Region Board meeting in West Lafayette, IN. The meeting was held at the University Plaza Hotel and hosted by the Central Indiana Division. I want to thank Steve Studley and Chuck Tuttle for arranging the facilities for the meeting. And I also want to thank Chuck Tuttle for hosting the operating session that Friday evening. It was a very enjoyable time.

There have been several train shows in the area recently. The CID held the annual Carmel Clay library event that I understand was very successful. The annual Danville, IN train show was held in November and even though I missed this meet for the first time, I understand that it was very successful. This meet has a different setup as it is a dealer sales/swap meet style. There is no admission to get into the meet. It tends to draw fairly well.

That week end I was planning on visiting the adjoining division annual fall Louisville show. It was on the same day, same time as the Danville show. We need to coordinate our shows so as not to conflict. I didn't make either show as my wife Sunny had a bad cold that day and Continued on page 3




