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### **Editor's Column**

My wife and I have decided to downsize. Of course that means moving and what of the railroad? I have never really finished any layout over the years and this one was no exception.

For those of you that do not know, I am modeling a single town. I choose Waupaca, Wisconsin for various reasons, foremost being that the original Wisconsin Central Railway, later the Soo Line built through it in 1871 and the Waupaca Green Bay Railroad, later the Green Bay & Western came in 1907.

I am still enamored with the town and want to rebuild it once we move. But this move is also temporary, as we plan to move to Florida after I retire in a few years. So when I rebuild the layout, it must not only be portable, but able to withstand the environment of Florida.

Jim Osborn told me about Micore<sup>™</sup>1600, which he used on his layout, instead of homasote. It has the advantage of not absorbing moisture, so I will use that. Since the layout is a big shelf, I will rebuild it in 4x3 foot sections that can then be bolted together. I assembled 5 modules so far, and covered them with 1/4 inch plywood, which the Micore will be attached to. I have been taking all the buildings off the old layout and placing them on the modules to map out where I need to lav track. I used a roll of christmas wrap paper for a template. The reverse side is printed with one inch squares, which assures that everything is aligned correctly.

I drew my track plan and building locations on the paper and then rolled it up for safekeeping. The main problem is making sure that no turnouts are built directly over a joint.

When laying out the buildings, I found that I had room for a building that I wanted on the old layout, but did not have space for. Although it was not served directly by the Soo or GBW it was a prominent building and very distinctive, built right on the river to provide waterpower.

Since I had not taken a lot of photos when I was photographing the town 20 years ago, I had to go back. I thought that I would go during Strawberry Fest.

in June, but I have to work that Saturday. As luck would have it, the Winnebagoland Spring meet was in Waupaca, so I reserved a room and went.

I always enjoy going to the Winnebagoland meets, they are a great bunch of guys, and many are fellow board members of the Soo Line Historical & Technical Society, so I always feel at home. The program was great, the food (Wisconsin bratwurst) delicious and of course there are always Lynn's homemade cookies.

I got photos of every angle of the building, going in the early morning and again in the afternoon. As it was still cool, the trees had not leafed out, a perfect time for taking modeling photos. I even got over to the depot to see the progress that Mike Kirk is making. Every time I go he has finished another room, or made some other improvement. His level of energy amazes me.

President Paul Mangan called the meeting to order at 8:56 am at the Best Western Plus Hotel & Conference Center in Schaumburg, Illinois. Paul thanked Jeff Jarr and the Fox Valley Division for hosting the 2014 Spring Convention and the DuPage Division for assisting with the convention.

Minutes from the Annual Meeting of Members held on May 4, 2013 were unanimously approved as written and published in the Summer 2013 issue of the Waybill

### Reports:

Bert Lattan summarized Region finances. As of December 31, 2013 the General Fund and the Youth Fund had combined assets of \$43,071.72. For the year then ended, income, primarily from Milepost 50 convention income, Waybill subscriptions and the NMRA dues rebate was \$9,323.66; expenses, primarily for the Waybill, were \$9.093.33 and net income was \$230.33.

### 2015 Election

### Petition Deadline Is September 24, 2014

Although the 2015 election is several months away, it is time to start the election cycle. In 2015 we will elect a President, a Vice President and three (3) Directors-at-Large. Paul Mangan and Steve Studley will complete their first two-year terms as President & Vice President, respectively, and under the Bylaws will be eligible to run for another term in 2015. Jim Allen and David Leider, both from the Fox Valley Division, will complete their second two-year terms in 2015 and under the Bylaws will not be eligible to run for another term in 2015. Thanks to Jim and David for their dedicated service. Linda Sukup will complete her first two-year term in 2015 and will be eligible to run for another term.

By serving the Midwest Region and your fellow NMRA members as a Director-at-Large for two terms (four years), you will qualify for the Association Official certificate under the NMRA Achievement Program. You will also meet many NMRA members from other Divisions and perhaps form lasting friendships.

There are two ways that your name can be placed on the ballot. The first is by recommendation of the Nominating Committee and approval of the Board of Directors. To be considered by the Nominating Committee (Chairman Dave Johnson from the Fox Valley Division and Members Lou Venema from the Central Indiana Division and Mike Vivion from the South Central Wisconsin Division), you must submit a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo to the Committee with a copy to the Region Secretary (Bert Lattan) as soon as possible, but no later than September 24, 2014. The preferred method of delivery is electronic mail. (While e-mail is not required to serve on the Board, it is highly desirable since the Board conducts pre and post meeting activity by e-mail.) If you do not have e-mail, you may mail your bio/photo to Bert Lattan, who will convert it to an electronic format and send it to the Committee. Addresses and e-mail addresses for the Committee and the Secretary are on the Board of Directors page of the Region website (www.mwr-nmra.org).

The second method is by petition signed by at least ten (10) current NMRA members who live in the Midwest Region. The petition form is available on the Region website or it may be requested from Bert Lattan. Your petition must be accompanied by a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passportstyle photo. It must be received by Bert Lattan no later than September 24, 2014. He will convert it to an electronic format and forward it to the Committee.

The Committee will submit its recommendations and the names of all resident members nominated by petition to the Board of Directors for review and approval during its next meeting, which is scheduled for Sunday, November 9, 2014 during Trainfest in West Allis, Wisconsin. Each candidate's biography/statement & photo and a ballot will be included in the Winter 2014 issue of the Waybill. The results of the election will be announced during the 2015 Annual Meeting of Members, which will be held during the 2015 Spring Convention. The convention will be hosted by the Winnebagoland Division and will be held on Friday, Saturday & Sunday, April 17, 18 & 19 at the Holiday Inn in Manitowoc, Wisconsin.


