

## Petition Deadline for Directors and Officers Is September 24, 2014

In 2015 we will elect a President, a Vice President and three (3) Directors-at-Large. Paul Mangan and Steve Studley will complete their first two-year terms as President and Vice President, respectively, and under the Bylaws will be eligible to run for another term in 2015. Jim Allen and David Leider, will complete their second two-year terms in 2015 and will not be eligible to run for another term in 2015. Linda Sukup will complete her first two-year term in 2015 and will be eligible to run for another term.

There are two ways that your name can be placed on the ballot. The first is by recommendation of the Nominating Committee and approval of the Board of Directors. To be considered by the Nominating Committee,



you must submit a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo to the Committee with a copy to the Region Secretary (Bert Lattan) as soon as possible, but no later than September 24, 2014. Addresses and e-mail addresses for the Committee and the Secretary are on the Board of Directors page of the Region website (www.mwr-nmra.org).

The second method is by petition signed by at least ten (10) current NMRA members who live in the Midwest Region. The petition form is available on the Region website or it may be requested from Bert Lattan. Your petition must be accompanied by a biography and candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo. It must be received by Bert Lattan no later than September 24, 2014.

The Committee will submit its recommendations to the Board of Directors for review and approval during its next meeting, which is scheduled for Sunday, November 9, 2014 during Trainfest in West Allis, Wisconsin. The results of the election will be announced during the 2015 Annual Meeting of Members, which will be held during the 2015 Spring Convention.

#### 2015 Election Update

Nominating Committee Chair Tony Koester's report was presented to the Board of Directors at the Annual BOD Meeting in Cleveland. Unfortunately, about a week after the Convention Banquet, the only candidate for At-Large-North American Director (ALNAD) withdrew his name from consideration. With input from Nominations Committee Chair Tony Koester and the approval of NMRA Counsel Bob Amsler and the Board of Directors, we will be following the schedule shown below for this election only. These are the current proposed slate of candidates and procedures:

The five positions except for ALNAD are now in the By-Petition phase. The By-Petition Process is explained under Article X Nominations, Ballots, and Voting paragraph #3. Your petition needs to be presented to the Secretary no later than September 15, 2014.

#### The ALNAD position

The ALNAD position is still in the normal Nominating Committee Process. There are currently two candidates that have already gone through the Nominating Committee Process. If you are interested in being a candidate for the ALNAD position, contact Nominating Committee Chair Tony Koester at nkpfan@ptd.net. The deadline for this phase of the process is August 31, 2014.

## SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CLEVELAND CONVENTION AND BOARD MEETING

The Board meeting was held on July 12 and 13 at the Renaissance Cleveland Hotel. As always, the official minutes, as recorded by NMRA Secretary John Stevens, will appear on the NMRA website (www.nmra.org) and in NMRA Magazine.

- Plans for "The Magic of Scale Model Railroading" exhibit at the California State Railroad Museum are still moving forward, albeit very slowly. As President Charlie Getz describes it, "For them, this is an outside-the-box thing, so [the state] is taking their time drafting the final agreement to make sure it's all perfect. So far they've approved the design and we have an initial agreement. It's the language in the final agreement that's the hard part."
- The Member Discount Program is moving forward in a slightly different direction than was initially planned. The NMRA presented the idea to two national home centers, but received virtually no response or reaction. Currently the team is working on discounts to historic railroads and other railroad-related activities. If you are an executive at a national chain of any type or know someone who is, the NMRA would love to talk with you to explain how this program could be mutually beneficial to your company and our members. - The NMRA has cancelled plans to reincorporate in the State of Missouri because recent changes to Ohio non-profit law have made remaining an Ohio corporation much more favorable to us.

 After an impressive presentation by Rocky Mountain Region representative Alan Anderson, the Board approved Salt Lake City as the site of the 2019 national convention.
 Tentative dates are July 8 - 16. As a reminder, upcoming conventions are:

> 2015: Portland, OR 2016: Indianapolis, IN 2017: Orlando, FL 2018: Kansas City, MO 2019: Salt Lake City, UT

- Work on vertically integrating the NMRA is continuing. This vertical integration will give every Region and Division 501(c)(3) not-for-profit status with a minimal hassle to all parties. In addition, Charlie Getz stressed that each Division and Region will continue to control its own programs and finances. The NMRA National will not get involved in the day-to-day business of Divisions and Regions. Currently two Regions and one Division will be used as a test case to see if or where problems develop. Those problems will be worked out before the plan is introduced to the entire NMRA system.
- John Parrish, NMRA Marketing Director, resigned his position because of time commitments. President Charlie Getz is currently looking for a replacement.
- Alan Anderson, NMRA Development and Fundraising Department Manager, reported that more and more members are designating the NMRA as their charity of choice when they sell items on eBay. He also reminded everyone that they can see a list of items on eBay that benefit the NMRA by visiting http://goo.gl/Ks8uE7.
- 113 models -- a new record -- were entered in the judged modeling contest at the Cleveland Convention. In total, 460 models appeared in the contest room, beating the Milwaukee Convention's previous record of 359.
- The Membership Booth recruiting team, lead by "Doc" Chait and Jody Hendricks, signed up over 90 RailPass members at the National Train Show on Friday alone.

On Wednesday, July 16, the NMRA held its Annual General Membership Meeting, which was combined with a "Meet the President" session. This meeting was packed with facts about the NMRA, its current state and its future as well as its programs, plans, and finances. 
