President's Report

Now that we have got some real traction on rebuilding the process for putting on the spring conventions, I think it is time to take a hard look at the two meetings we traditionally hold as part of the convention, the Board of Directors meeting, and the annual Meeting of the Membership.

The Midwest Region holds two Board of Directors meet-

ings per year. The spring meeting is supposed to be part of the regional convention, and the fall meeting was hosted by one of the divisions. For a long time, we held the fall meeting at Trainfest. These locations worked because most of the BOD was going to be at the host event. But still, attendance was hit or miss. In those days, this was the only practical method for the BOD to get together.

Post Covid, we have been trying to make the BOD meeting easier to attend by changing the days and locations. I thought it would be a good thing for the BOD to visit more of the Divisions. The results have been mixed. It seems no matter where we go or what day we pick, a fair number of the BOD members will have a conflict or not be able to do the travel needed to get to the meeting. We have had a Zoom option for those who couldn't travel to the meeting and that has helped a bit.

I could now go into many paragraphs of examples of why the current process for holding the BOD meetings is not working very well but life is short. So here are my conclusions:

1) By holding the BOD meeting as part of some other event we are creating attendance con-

flicts for the BOD members. You have to take time out of the event you are attending to go to a BOD meeting.

- 2) The time and cost of travel to attend a twohour BOD meeting is becoming excessive. Many of the BOD members are already priced out of attending the meetings.
- 3) If we want to have active BOD members, we have to make it easier to be part of the BOD meetings.

One of the action items at the most recent BOD meeting was to set the date and time of the spring 2024 BOD meeting. I turned it into a discussion of how we hold these meetings and is it time to go to an online meeting? I got a lot less push back than I expected. It seems I am not the only one with some doubts about the logistics of the live meetings. So, we are going to look into changing the format of the meetings. All options are on the table at this time.

As part of the discussion, we decided to hold the spring meeting in coordination with the upcoming convention in South Bend. It will be on the Sunday after the convention because we figure most of the BOD that attends the convention won't be going home until Sunday so it will not add a hotel night to the cost, and it will not tangle up the convention proper with BOD meeting.

One of the other action items of the recent BOD meeting was to set a date for the 2024 annual Meeting of the Members. I questioned the need to even hold this meeting any longer. We present a few reports to the membership at these meetings. Reports we could send to each member. This meeting made a lot of sense back in the 1950's when communication options were so limited, but I think we have outgrown the need for this meeting.

We will hold the MOM right after the spring BOD meeting, but we are going to look into dropping it. Maybe will replace it with a regional Zoom session or maybe a regional report we will email to you. Again, all options are on the table.

My bottom line on these meetings is we seriously need to review how we put them on. Can we find lower cost and more time efficient ways to do it? We are a volunteer organization. One thing about volunteers, you can't ask for more than they are willing to give. Asking a BOD member to spend hundreds of dollars and ten hours of drive time to attend a two-hour meeting is not going to encourage folks to volunteer for the job.


I joined the NMRA 6 years ago and have started getting more and more involved with the Lafayette group and the Indy group of train guys through op. sessions.

Director-At-Large Phillip Burnside **Central Indiana Division**



Sunshine Region Convention By David J. Leider MMR®

I had the pleasure to meet Gordy Robinson MMR®, president of the NMRA at the recent Sunshine Region Convention. I found him to be friendly and insightful, with a dry sense of humor.

He spoke of some current and future changes in the NMRA, including recognizing people for 2, 5 and 10 years participation, rather than the usual 25 and 50 years. The idea is to make people feel welcome. It has been found that if new members stay 3 years, chances they will stay 12-13 years.

As part of his campaign on transparency, he showed where every dollar of the dues was spent.

This year a lot of members were added and if projections hold, this will be the first year since 1992 that membership has increased over the prior year.

He pointed out that there are about 350-450,000 model railroaders in the country and that Virtual Railfan, a U-Tube channel, has 670,000 followers. Yet there are only 550 members in the Sunshine Region and only about 75 attended the convention. He asked where the others were, and why hasn't Florida, with its booming population, attracted more members.

His goals for the NMRA include: Increasing engagement and brand awareness.

What a great train show we had just last month. First of all, I want to thank everyone that helped with the show because without you I could not have done it. We had over 1,400 people including attendees, vendors, volunteers.

We are looking forward to a great show again next year which will be held on August 3rd and 4th. We did a lot of marketing for this show all over the Midwest Region Area along with the surrounding Regions. We add new vendors and 4 new manufacturers. Everyone express what a good time they had and was looking forward to next year. I had vendors asking me to sign up for next year before the 2023 train show was over.

We advertise in the following magazines for the Franklin Train Show 2023 which some of them are new to the Central Indiana Division but are familiar to the Midwest Region especially in the St. Louis area. Other ways we continue to get the word out about the show. We are using all forms of social media to promote this show to maximum ability within our budget that we have, and where I can get free advertising, I take full advantage of it at the local level and regional and national level. We also have newspapers information about the show to publish in their local newspaper on local events happening in the area we canvas the whole state of Indiana and parts of Ohio and Kentucky.

We advertised in Model Railroader, Classic Trains, Trains, Cowcatcher, NMRA, SRHA, Rail Model Craftsman, Model Railroad News, Model Railroad Hobbyist, Rusty Spike, Owl Car (WISE Div.), Illinois Terminal Division, DuPage Division, Michiana Division, The Waybill, Facebook and state newspapers in IN, KY, OH. We will be on WFMS in August. Festival Country, Indiana will promote our show on the radio in Franklin closer to the show.

We sold a total of 261 tables to vendors. The American Legion, VFW Post and Ladies Auxiliary was a great help with looking for arm bands at the doors. We let them have tables to promote their organizations in return. The Beech Grove Moose Lodge provided the lunch for a reasonable cost to the attendees and vendors, without the support of these two groups this show would have a higher cost overhead.

Between all of them we had 18 come out and help us.

We had NMRA member Randy Bowman's wife and two sons who helped set up and tear down tables this year and that was a great help. We appreciate them very much. The boy scout troop double booked themselves and was unable to help but we will get them for next year.

With the increase in table cost this year we still had vendors on the waiting list. We grew the manufacturing side of the vendors and that has been paying off for this year alone. We continue to make this show to have the best mix of manufacturers and mom and pop vendors which are the Divisions main source of vendors.

With a developed base of manufacturers that will draw attendance we will build a strong and loyal attendance base for years to come that will draw from not just the local area but the surrounding states as the best 2-day division show in the Indianapolis Area. We are starting to see the fruits of the ground work that I laid out five years ago when I took over the show in 2019.

We had the following layouts at the Franklin Train Show 2023, Trevor Jones, Cintrak, Pacific & Eastern, Indiana Large Scale Railroaders, Indiana Live Steam, Middlefork Railroad Club, Johnson County Live Steamers, Ella Shelton and Dave Little, these are just a few of the layouts that was at the Franklin Train Show.

Clubs are an integral part of the train show and I have been working with the following clubs to get them back at the show again next year. The following clubs were Middlefork, Cintrak, Pacific & Eastern Club and Naptown. Yes, these are just a few of the clubs that were at the show.

We had an American Rail Passenger Representative to present information on Amtrak rail safety free to the public. We will continue to bring them back as Passenger service is a very integral part of our history and our future.

We are going to use Facebook again to help with marketing. There was a change in the Franklin Train Show flyer, one is designed for Facebook, Reedit, and other social media platforms. I have a Vendor Show Flyer that is produced in house and a Train Show Flyer that is now sent to the printer that shows attendees will pick up more often because it is geared for them and not the vendors.

We will be having door prizes like we do every

year. We always have plenty of door prizes for Saturday and Sunday. You do not have to be present to win these but you must fill out an attendee registration form with complete readable information so we can contact you. The attendee registration form will be used for the door prizes so please fill one out if you would like a chance to win. There will also be some door prizes during each day that you must be present to win. We have some door prizes already for the train show.

I will be sending out vendor registration before long because I have had vendors call me asking for them. They want to get their tables paid for all ready for next year. Looking to have a great train show again in 2024.

National News

The question came up at the recent MWR BOD meeting as to how many NMRA members have emails and have signed up for access for the website. The answer is very surprising. Of the 16,600 or so members, 14,450 have emails on file with National. Of those 9,266 members have an nmra.org account. 225 of the 9,266 have created an account but never signed in..

So roughly 64% of those with an email have taken time to create an account. That is 58% of the total NMRA membership so barely half of the members take advantage of the NMRA site. Daniel Banks
